BIG 12 ANNOUNCES WEYERHAEUSER KING COUNTY AQUATIC CENTER WILL HOST ITS 2025 SWIMMING & DIVING CHAMPIONSHIP!

IRVING, Texas — The Big 12 Conference has selected Weyerhaeuser King County Aquatic Center in Federal Way, Wash., to serve as the host site for the 2025 Big 12 Swimming and Diving Championship.

This will mark the first neutral site for the Championship as it has been hosted on a Big 12 campus each year since 1997. Beginning in 2025, Arizona, Arizona State and Utah will join BYU, Cincinnati, Houston, Iowa State, Kansas, TCU and West Virginia as Big 12 institutions that compete in Swimming & Diving.

"We are excited to welcome all Big 12 and NCAA Division I collegiate athletes and their families to make the City of Federal Way their 'home away from home' for the 2025 Swimming and Diving Championships," said **Federal Way Mayor Jim Ferrell**. "Federal Way is centered on opportunities for these athletes to visit, compete, and play. Congratulations athletes and Welcome to Federal Way!"

"We're honored to host the Big 12 Swimming and Diving Championship, offering a modernized facility that provides an outstanding experience for elite athletes and their fans," said King County Executive Dow Constantine. "We've made significant improvements at our Weyerhaeuser King County Aquatic Center in recent years, making it brighter, more energy efficient, and more comfortable for swimmers of all ages and abilities, including collegiate superstars."

Dates for the 2025 Championship will be **Tuesday, February 25 - Saturday, March 1**. The WKCAC will also be the site of the 2025 NCAA DI Women's and Men's Swimming and Diving Championships.

Further information about the 2025 Championship will be released at a later date. The 2024 Big 12 Swimming & Diving Championship is set for Feb. 27 - March 2 in Morgantown, West Virginia, hosted by West Virginia.

It's time for another History Lesson!

On February 19, City Hall was closed in observance of President's Day. This day typically means no school for children and no work for most employees, but upon its creation in 1879, this day was about honoring our Founding Fathers, specifically George Washington, on his birthday.

Although Washington was born on February 22 — or February 11 if you're following the Julian Calendar! — in 1968, the Uniform Monday Holiday Act moved Washington's Birthday Celebration to the third Monday of the month. Then, it became President's Day as a way to remember all the U.S. presidents or any single president of choice.

This holiday even has its dessert assigned to it – Cherry Pie! This dessert is a little tongue-in-cheek nod to the longest-running myth and legend about George Washington:

"The cherry tree myth is one of the oldest and best-known legends about George Washington. In the original story, when Washington was six years old, he received a hatchet as a gift and damaged his father's cherry tree with it. When his father discovered what George had done, he became very angry. Young George bravely said, 'I cannot tell a lie...I did cut it with my hatchet.' Washington's father embraced him and declared that his son's honesty was worth more than a thousand trees" (George Washington's Mount Vernon Archives).

So grab a slice of cherry pie and celebrate all 46 presidents, or just your favorite, because President's Day was about a little bit of history.

- One copy each of utility bill paid in 2023 for the following utilities only:
 - O Gas, Electric, Water, Sewer, Garbage, and Telephone/Cell Phone/Cable
 - O Documentation must show the bill was paid.
 - O DO NOT send original bills. Paperwork will NOT be returned.
