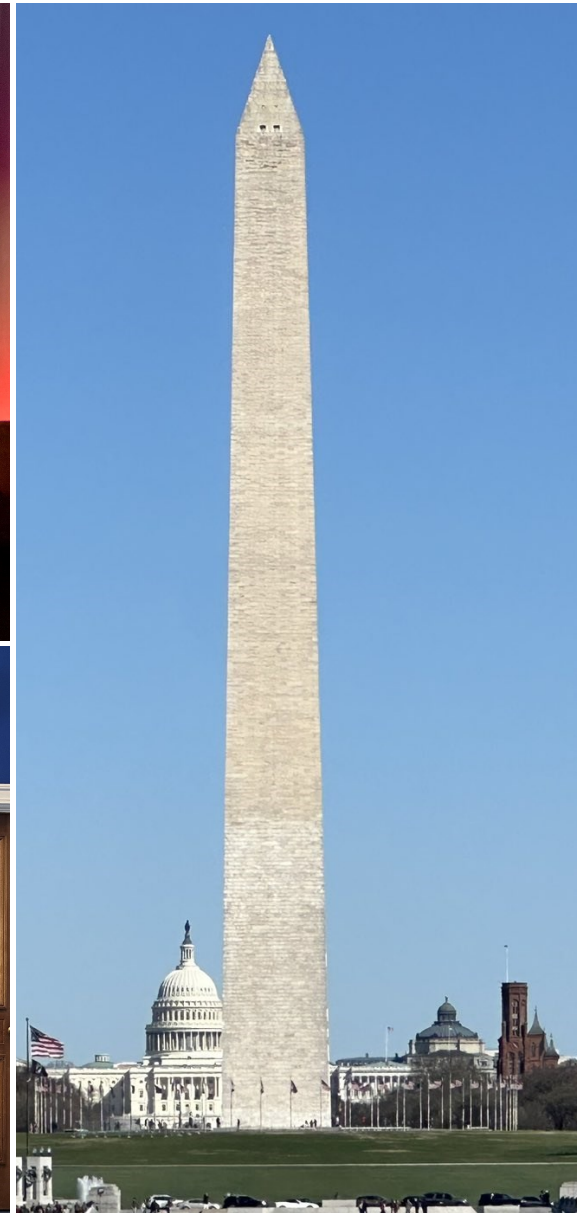

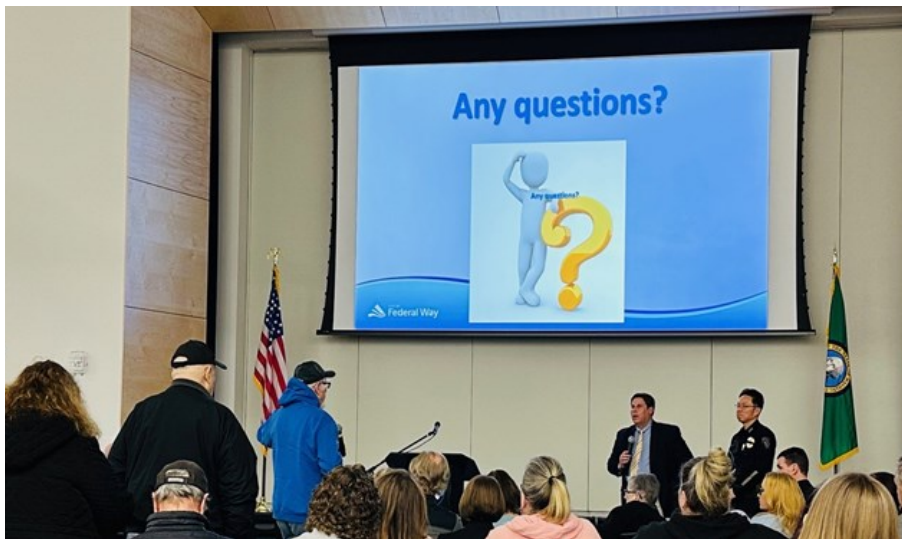

FWPD EQUIPS ITS OFFICERS WITH AXON BODY-WORN CAMERAS

The Federal Way Police Department (FWPD) outfitted all officers with AXON body-worn cameras in December 2021.

Body-worn cameras are a significant step toward greater transparency and accountability, increasing public trust during interactions with our officers.

The cameras also provide officers' perspectives on calls for service and quicker and unbiased resolutions to potential community member concerns.

Using cameras increases public confidence in policing, deters criminal activity, helps de-escalate confrontational situations, and provides additional skill development and training through incident review.



FWPD officers who frequently interact with community members must wear and operate body-worn cameras. It is mandatory to turn on the cameras during calls for service and other activities, including but not limited to traffic stops, vehicle pursuits, responding to suspicious vehicles or persons, arrests, vehicle searches, domestic violence incidents, use of force, DUI investigations, crimes in progress, offenses involving weapons, mental health-related contacts, and welfare checks.

THE COMMUNITY GATHERS FOR OUR YEARLY IRISH FLAG-RAISING CEREMONY AT CITY HALL!

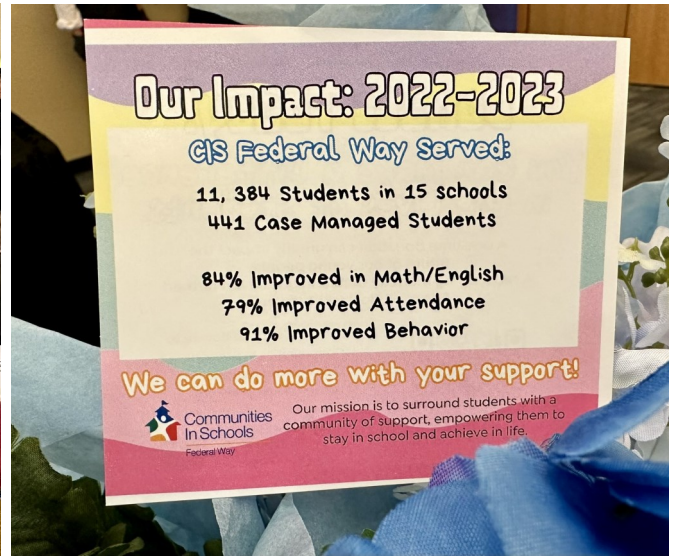

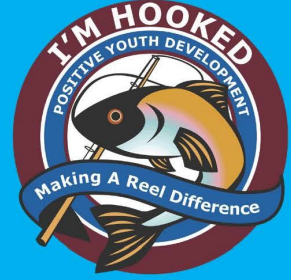

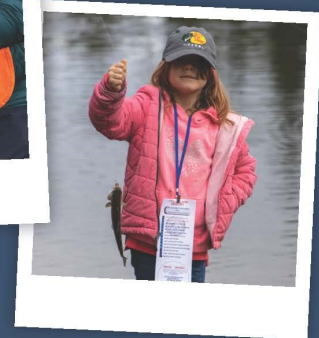
