





In September of 2022, more than 100 people gathered in Council Chambers to celebrate the 30th Anniversary of the Korean Community Quarterly Meeting.

At this event, former Mayor Mike Park introduced members of the Korean community to city leadership and introduced special guest performers worthy of such an event, sharing 30 years of collaboration and outreach.





The Korean Community in Federal Way is one of the largest single Korean populations in any state.

With almost 6% of the population identifying as Korean, this community has deep roots in Federal Way.

Many within this population have retained their native tongue; some struggle with understanding English; all strive to connect to the City they call home.

Thus, in 1992, the first Korean Community Quarterly Meeting was held. During this meeting, with opening remarks from the Mayor and City Council, the various departments of the City gathered to provide translated updates to the Korean community. The Korean American Parents Association provided a meal after the event.



On March 21, the Korean Community held its first quarterly meeting in City Hall's chambers.

Former Mayor Park and Council President Linda Kochmar gave opening remarks before department leads took the microphone to share updates on Community Development, Economic Development, Finance, Parks, Public Works, and Federal Way Police.

And, as usual, the Korean American Parents Association ensured no one left hungry!

The quarterly meeting is on the third Thursday of March, June, September, and December. After 126 meetings, there is no sign of stopping.



What is CERT? - The Greater Federal Way (GFW) Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Program provides residents of the Federal Way Community with disaster preparedness skills to protect themselves, their families, and their neighbors. It also teaches the skills and organizational structure to respond to the immediate needs of the community, supporting First Responders in the event of an emergency or disaster.

<u>Training is Free</u> – Upon graduation, each student volunteer receives their own backpack with CERT gear and a certificate of completion.


