IN A HISTORIC MOMENT, THE CITY COUNCIL UNANIMOUSLY APPROVES A DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT FOR TOWN CENTER 3!



On Tuesday, April 16, our dedicated City Councilmembers unanimously approved a Town Center 3 (TC 3) Development Agreement with One Trent, a Seattle-based development company that will invest hundreds of millions of dollars in our community. Additionally, the City Council unanimously approved the Tax Increment Financing (TIF) on second reading and final approval, which will facilitate the investment of millions of dollars toward necessary capital improvements. TIF provides funding for infrastructure that enables private property owners to contribute to the development and improvement of the City. Our next step is to enter into meaningful negotiations with Merlone Geier Partners, the owners of The Commons Mall on 320th, to transform that site. This week represents a hinge point for Federal Way's future!



In November 2014, our City Council unanimously approved the purchase of the former Target property, per Mayor Jim Ferrell's request. "At the time, I recognized that this was somewhat controversial," said Ferrell. "However, I knew that this \$10 million investment would be the linchpin of our efforts toward revitalization and investment in our community ... and will pay dividends for decades."




FEDERAL WAY OFFICERS TAKE PRIDE IN BEING A PART OF THE HIGHLY TRAINED VALLEY SWAT TEAM



The Valley SWAT team (VSWAT) is comprised of a dedicated group of professionals who save lives in dangerous situations. A multijurisdictional team, VSWAT consists of officers, sergeants, and commanders from Auburn, Des Moines, Federal Way, Kent, the Port of Seattle, Renton, and Tukwila.

The team responds to high-risk search and arrest warrants, active shooter events, barricaded suspects, hostage situations, terrorist acts, dignitary protection, and other criminal occurrences that require a tactical response that is beyond the capabilities of regular patrol officers or detectives.







Special Weapons and Tactics, or SWAT, are widely recognized and familiar to many people. SWAT officers undergo a rigorous selection process that requires years of law enforcement experience, a review of their job history and performance, and passing a fitness test that includes challenging exercises while wearing a gas mask and heavy tactical vest.

Teamwork is essential as operations are complex and require specialized roles, and officers must adapt to changing situations.

SWAT's primary goal is to save lives.

VSWAT members take this goal very seriously, continuously learning, practicing, and preparing so that when a critical call happens, they are well-suited to ensure the safest outcome!









What is CERT? - The Greater Federal Way (GFW) Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Program provides residents of the Federal Way Community with disaster preparedness skills to protect themselves, their families, and their neighbors. It also teaches the skills and organizational structure to respond to the immediate needs of the community, supporting First Responders in the event of an emergency or disaster.

<u>Training is Free</u> – Upon graduation, each student volunteer receives their own backpack with CERT gear and a certificate of completion.


