


M'S SUMMER CAMP HOSTS SIX THRU TWELVE YEAR OLDS

PUBLIC WORKS AND WASTE MANAGEMENT OFFER NEW OPTIONS TO RECYCLE COOKING OIL



Did you know you can recycle your used cooking oil in Federal Way? Residents can now bring used cooking oil to our drop box at French Lake Dog Park. Simply fill up jugs with cooking oil, dump into our drop box, and throw away or reuse your containers.

Also, Residential WM customers in Federal Way can also set out used cooking and motor oil at the curb on recycling day for free pick-up. Limit of 3 gallons per pickup and 10 gallons per year.





Are you and your family prepared for a natural disaster or other emergency? The Greater Federal Way Community Emergency Response Team (GFW CERT) is hosting a free CERT Basic Course this fall to teach critical skills to prepare for and respond to hazards like earthquakes, volcanoes, severe storms, fires, and other major emergencies. The CERT Basic Course also teaches the skills and organizational structure to respond to the immediate needs of the community, supporting First Responders in the event of an emergency or disaster. Training is Free Upon graduation, each student volunteer receives their own backpack with CERT gear and a certificate of completion and is invited to become part of the GFW CERT program, supporting their neighbors in the event of a disaster or emergency.

Feel the confidence and security knowing that you and your family are ready for anything. Join us each Wednesday evening from 6:00 to 8:30pm starting September 18th in the Patrick Maher Room on the first floor of Federal Way City Hall. Classes will run through November 20th culminating in a realistic disaster response exercise.
