HOW FORENSICS HELP SOLVE CRIMES

Unveiling the Mystery: How Forensics Helps Solve Crimes

Did you know that the Federal Way Police Department uses advanced forensic techniques to solve cases and keep our neighborhoods safe? Forensics isn't just a buzzword from crime dramas; it's a fascinating field that blends science and detective work to solve real -life mysteries.


What are Forensics?

Forensics refers to the application of scientific methods and techniques to investigate crimes. This involves gathering and analyzing physical evidence such as fingerprints, DNA, videos,

photographs, and digital data. By using cutting-edge technology and expert analysis, forensic specialists help piece together the puzzle of what happened during a crime.

The Forensic Process

When a crime occurs, our police officers secure the scene to ensure that no evidence is compromised. This could involve anything from a broken window to a discarded item. If the crime is serious enough, specially trained detectives arrive to document the scene and collect evidence. Some evidence can be processed in-house by our detectives, while other evidence requires expensive scientific instruments and must be sent to state crime labs for analysis.



Here are some examples of evidence that our police department gathers at crime scenes:

- **1. Evidence Collection**: Every detail matters! Investigators collect fingerprints, hair, fibers, and even trace amounts of substances. Each piece of evidence can tell a story.
- **2. DNA Analysis**: One of the most powerful tools in forensics is DNA analysis. By examining biological samples—like blood or saliva—investigators can identify suspects or victims with remarkable accuracy.

3. Ballistics: For crimes involving firearms, ballistics experts analyze bullets and shell casings. They can determine the type of weapon used and even link a bullet to a specific gun, helping to establish connections between different crimes.

4. Digital Forensics: In our tech-driven world, digital evidence is crucial. Forensic experts analyze computers, smartphones, and social media to uncover vital information about

suspects and their activities.

Success Stories

Our police department has experienced significant successes thanks to forensic science. For instance, DNA found at a murder scene in 2002 recently matched with a suspect who had been arrested for violent felonies in 2022. After the DNA confirmation, detectives developed enough information to arrest the suspect and hold him accountable for something he thought he got away with 20 years ago.

As technology continues to advance, so does the field of forensics. New techniques, like 3D crime scene reconstruction and artificial intelligence in data analysis, promise to make investigations even more efficient and effective.

SAMP PUBLIC COMMENT PROCESS



The Puget Sound region is expected to grow by another one million people by 2035. The Sustainable Airport Master Plan (SAMP) is the blueprint for changes at Seattle-Tacoma International Airport (SEA) to meet future forecasted demand. SAMP identifies 31 Near-Term Projects (NTPs) that are intended to improve efficiency, safety, access to the airport, and support facilities for airlines and the airport. The NTPs, if approved, will be complete or under construction by 2032.

SAMP and the scoping process for the environmental review was completed in 2018. Currently, the **National Environmental Policy Act** (NEPA) Environmental Assessment (EA) and 45-day public comment period is underway for SEA's SAMP recommended 31 NTPs.

At the conclusion of the comment period on **December 5, 2024**, all comments received will be reviewed and taken into consideration by the FAA and the Port during the preparation of the final NEPA EA. Responses to comments will be included in the final EA.

This public meeting is the beginning of outreach by the Port about the proposed airport expansion that will continue into late 2025. It is essential that our residents be fully involved and have a voice in this public comment process. The meeting will be a way for our residents to weigh in on the projects and how they would result in greater aircraft noise and health impacts

from aircraft emissions. Comments may be mailed, emailed, submitted on the web; and residents may also testify in person to a hearing examiner. Residents should take advantage of this opportunity so that they can make informed public comments to the Federal Aviation Administration and the Port. The expansion will add a new passenger terminal, 19 gates, additional cargo facilities, and other projects for

a total of 31 projects. These projects are proposed as there is a projected increase in annual passengers handled will go from 46.9 million in 2017 to 56 million in 2027, and further increasing to 66 million by 2034. The Federal Way City Council will be finalizing a response before the December 13, 2024 deadline for comment.
