

School Cafeteria Sorting is Easy!




Amounts

- Students make 14,500 tons of garbage per day. That is the same weight as 2,000 school buses!
- World Wildlife Federation estimates that each student in King County wastes 44 pounds of food per year at school. That is a lot!





Why is reducing waste, recycling, and composting at school important?



We are Composting and composting in the cafeteria this year!



Let's become experts on where items go!



You will see 3 containers in the cafeteria.

What type of container is each color? Green? Blue? Grey?





Green is for compost/organics Blue is for recycle Grey is for garbage





Green is for compost/organics





Food scraps + other compostable materials





NO foamNO plasticNO glassNO strawsNO metalNO tissues





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Food scraps are composted into new soil in just 8 weeks and used on local gardens.







What is better than composting food?







What is better than composting food? Try to eat your food and finish your milk!







What is better than composting food?

If you cannot finish it, take it home if it is packed or if it is unopened and wrapped- place on share table if your school has one.










What if you opened your food?





Empty your loose food in the compost container.

Throw the empty plastic bag away.

Remember, NO PLASTIC IN THE COMPOST.

Blue is for recycling





NO paper coffee cups NO candy, gum,



NO Milk cartons or Juice boxes

NO straws, bottle caps, or lids



NO plastic utensils

NO napkins,

paper towels, or tissues


NO plastic bags

NO juice cups





Materials collected for recycling are turned into new items. Cans back into cans Plastic bottles into bottles and other items.





Grey is for garbage.









Garbage will go to a landfill.









Let's Practice Sorting!



Which of these go in the compost?

There are 4 right answers! MILK

Compostable items

Only food and napkins. These are the correct items. Remember NO Plastic.







Which of these go in the recycling?

There are 2 right answers!



Recyclable Items

Cans, glass bottles, plastic bottles go in the recycling in the cafeteria. In the classroom, clean paper and cardboard is also recyclable.



Make sure these items are EMPTY, CLEAN, and DRY before going into the recycling





Which of these go in the garbage?

Hint: it is anything that we haven't already said is recyclable or compostable.



Garbage Items

When in doubt, throw it out. These items will go in the garbage: drink boxes, Foil drink pouches, plastic utensils and straws, chip bags and candy wrappers,

Food cups, plastic Ziplock bags.











Remember, if you are ever confused where items golook at the signs on the containers.



If you bring a lunch from home, try to reuse items to make a waste free lunch
