Tips for Finding a Financial Advisor

It is important to find a financial advisor that is ethical, knowledgeable, and able to help you with your particular situations. Please follow the following tips to get matched with the best financial advisor:

- 1. Ask for Referrals. A recommendation from someone you know and has worked with financial advisors before.
- 2. Check Industry Databases including the Certified Financial Planners, Financial Planning Association, and National Association of Personal Financial Advisors.
- 3. Make sure they're a fiduciary meaning that they will work in the best interest of you.
- 4. Don't put too much trust into titles. Use Paladin's Credential Checker to make sure they are legitimate.
- 5. Meet in Person and come prepared with details about your financial situation, your long-term goals, and any questions.

Common Elder Fraud Scams

- Romance Scam Criminals pose as interested romantic partners on social media or dating websites to capitalize on their elderly victims' desire to find companions.
- Tech Support Scam Criminals pose as technology support representatives and offer to fix non-existent computer issues. The scammers gain remote access to victims' devices and sensitive information.
- **Grandparent Scam** Criminals pose as a relative usually a child or grandchild claiming to be in immediate financial need.
- Government Impersonation Scam Criminals pose as government employees and threaten to arrest or prosecute victims unless they agree to provide funds or other payments.
- Sweepstakes / Charity / Lottery Scam Criminals claim to work for legitimate charitable organizations to gain victims' trust, or they claim their targets have won a foreign lottery or sweepstake, which they can collect for a "fee".
- Home Repair Scam Criminals appear in person and charge homeowners in advance for home improvement services that they never provide.
- TV / Radio Scam Criminals target potential victims using illegitimate advertisements about legitimate services, such as reverse mortgages or credit repair.
- Family / Caregiver Scam Relatives or acquaintances of elderly victims take advantage of them or otherwise get their money.

Protect Yourself - Fraud & Scams



- Recognize scam attempts and end all communication with the perpetrator.
- Search online for the contact information (name, email, phone number, addresses) and the proposed offer. Other people have likely posted information online about individuals and businesses trying to run scams.
- Resist the pressure to act quickly. Scammers create a sense of urgency to produce fear and lure victims into immediate action. Call the police immediately if you feel there is a danger to yourself or a loved one.
- Be cautious of unsolicited phone calls, mailings, and door-to-door service offers.
- Never give or send any personal identifiable information, money, jewelry, gift cards, checks, or wire information to unverified people or businesses.
- Make sure all computer anti-virus and security software and malware protections are up to date. Use reputable anti-virus software and firewalls.
- Disconnect from the internet and shut down your device if you see a pop-up message or locked screen. Pop-ups are regularly used by perpetrators to spread malicious software. Enable pop-up blockers to avoid accidentally clicking on a pop-up.
- Be careful what you download. Never open an email attachment from someone you don't know, and be wary of email attachments forwarded to you.

Take precautions to protect your identity if a criminal gains access to your device or account. Immediately contact your financial institutions to place protections on your accounts, and monitor your accounts and personal information for suspicious activity.

King County 211 connects people to the help they need. They provide the most comprehensive information on health and human services in King County, whether it is for housing assistance, help with financial needs, or to find the location of the nearest food bank.

The Utility Notification Center is open 24 hours per day, 7 days per week, and accepts call from contractors, homeowners, or anyone planning to dig. Locate requests are accepted over the phone, by face, or through the ITIC program. Whether you are a homeowner or a professional excavator, your call to 811 allows affected facility operators to locate and mark their underground facilities. There is no cost to you - even the call is

free - so call 811 before you dig!



The fire department will install detectors and batteries for those who are unable to do so themselves.

Fall Prevention - Educators will visit your home to do a safety survey. They will provide education on the reasons why falls happen and give you ideas on how to reduce injuries at home. They can also install risk reduction devices. You must be 50 years of age or older, live independently, have either fallen in the past or be at risk of falling, and live within King County to qualify.
