UPDATES FROM THE PAEC



We have exciting news from our friends at the **Performing Arts and Events Center (PAEC)!**

The Arts 4 Youth program is returning to the PAEC after a three-year hiatus due to the COVID-19 global pandemic.

What does the PAEC do?

The PAEC works with school districts to offer topnotch in-person schedules for educational shows for K-12 schools and offers \$5 tickets to students and free/discounted access to those who qualify.

Transportation grants are available to eligible schools. The PAEC aims to enrich our community through performing arts and provide cost-effective solutions to schools. Common Core-aligned lesson plans are also available for educators.

The PAEC encourages our Federal Way community to promote its program by talking to your child's teachers, principals, and school officials to see if their school is participating or aware of the **Arts 4 Youth program**.
