FWCC'S NEW LEISURE POOL AND SLIDE UPDATE! WE'RE MAKING GREAT PROGRESS



We're making a splash! Crews installed a new slide with a beautiful staircase, and the lazy river was replastered at the FWCC. All of the rust has been removed and treated from the lazy river. Parks Director John Hutton said, "Precautionary measures have been taken to keep that from ever happening again."

We're moving in the right direction with the recent installation of our **new leisure pool slide** at the **Federal Way Community Center (FWCC)**.

The pool replastering was **completed on August 8** and filled with water on **August 9** — not for the swimmers — as part of the curing process. The plaster must be in the water to properly cure.

August 10 was a huge FWCC milestone: we filled the pool and tested all the slide-and-play features!

We're excited to be one step closer to welcoming the public back into the pool, as this is a big step in that process!

While we know everyone is asking, "What is your opening day?" We are in the final stages of preparing the release date and will announce it soon. We appreciate your patience and understanding as we work through the details.

OUR FINANCIAL LITERACY PROJECT PILOT PROGRAM BEGINS NEXT MONTH



It is crucial to have financial literacy and competency at any age.

Mayor Ferrell is happy to announce that the City Council unanimously approved the Financial Literacy Project pilot program during the August 8 meeting.

We plan to initiate this program in the fall using our general fund.

The City will invite participants from organizations in our community for the course, held at the **Federal Way Community Center (FWCC) from September 14 to November 9** (6:30-8:30 p.m.) and will be available in multiple languages.

Recruitment for this project, operated by community volunteers, will begin shortly.

After six months, we will conduct exit interviews and evaluate their impact on individuals.

Up to 40 participants who meet the qualifying criteria are eligible to participate for free of charge.

SHOPLIFTING LEADS TO MORE THAN JUST A MISDEMEANOR





The **Federal Way Police Department** is sending a message on what can happen if anyone steals from our multipurpose stores — "routine" enforcement of misdemeanor offenses, such as shoplifting baby formula, sometimes **uncovers more significant crimes**.

Police officers working at **The Commons Mall** were recently dispatched to **Target** for the report of a theft.

The adult male suspect **used the self-checkout** lanes where he only scanned a few drinks but not the baby formula in his cart, totaling approximately **\$140 in stolen merchandise**.

When loss prevention officers contacted the man, he refused to stop. **Police officers at the mall were nearby and quickly apprehended the shoplifter**.

The man refused to provide his name or otherwise identify himself. Officers equipped with a **portable latent print device** quickly learned his true identity.

For over a year, the man had been evading a felony warrant out of Pierce County for failure to register as a sex offender.

The man was booked into Pierce County jail. His local charges for theft are pending after Pierce County finishes with him.




Our friends at the PAEC have been working around the clock to organize fantastic events!
