"I'm coaching in the Mariners 12-U and will the All-Star coaches for Federal Way, an opportunity to give back to the community. I can't think of a better way to shape the young people for future success."

"Who would have ever thought that someday I would come to work at the City of Federal Way [with Mayor Ferrell]?" said Hwang. "Baseball was my best sport, and I was the co-captain of the team my senior year. We still talk about it [the high school glory days]. So we go to community meetings and talk about it."

Finance staff held the initial kickoff conference with State Auditors Office (SAO) to begin the financial audit for the year ended 2022. The auditors provided their initial list of requested materials from Finance, and staff has already started that work. As last year, SAO staff will be working primarily remotely. We will inform other departments of any information requests beyond the records Finance has. The Bureau of Labor Statistics released the April CP1 numbers, and national inflation was 4.9% over the same month last year. The Finance staff reinvested a \$1 million investment maturing thi month that yielded 1.7%, with a 4-year investment earning 3.7%.

The Federal Way Police Department, to miligate the impact of legislation regarding police pursuits, has implemented the pilot program StarChase system in their patrol vehicle. This advanced technology allows law enforcement to track down suspects who try to escape in a vehicle. A recent traffic stop incident demonstrated the system's effectiveness in immobilizing a driver. The system tracks the car in real-time by firing the GPS tracker at the vehicle using a pneumatic launcher, negating the need for a high-speed chase. The department recorded its first successful capture and hopes for many more in the upcoming months.
