














IRG SHOWS CITY AROUND THE WOODBRIDGE CORPORATE PARK PROPERTY



Mayor Ferrell received a tour of the Woodbridge Corporate Park at the former Weyerhaeuser campus from Los Angeles -based Industrial Realty Group, LCC, a nationwide real estate development and investment firm. on July 12.

During the tour, Coby Holley, the Vice President and Asset Development Manager of IRG Realty Advisors, LLC, showed us around the property, which sits on 425 acres and provides 830,000 square feet of office, industrial, and lab space.



"The sale, redevelopment, and reuse of this iconic property by IRG is important for the future of Federal Way," **Mayor Ferrell** said. "We look forward to working with IRG to bring additional jobs, businesses, and sustainable development to Federal Way. Our location, support for businesses, and quality of life for our citizens put us in a strong position for the future."

According to IRG, this project is estimated to restore about half of the jobs lost and create **new employment opportunities in Federal Way**.

IRG purchased the property for \$70 million in 2016.

Our City looks forward to tenants moving into the Woodbridge Corporate Park!
















FWPD WILL HOST ITS ANNUAL RUN WITH THE COPS 5K NEXT MONTH

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Community Development staff met with applicants last week on proposed development agreements for the **Kitts Corner and Town Center 3 (TC-3) properties**.

A development agreement is a contract between the developer and the City that would guide the development of each of these properties.

Staff also met with individuals from **El Centro de la Raza** to discuss plans for their current and additional property they would like to purchase. Code Compliance staff worked with the **Washington State Department of Transportation** (WSDOT) to get an encampment cleaned on its I-5 property south of S 320th Street.

The Mayor's Community Space stakeholder group met for the second time on July 12 to discuss whether the City should explore constructing a new community space and relocating City Hall to the downtown area. In addition, staff are soliciting feedback from residents for the **Comprehensive Plan specific to the latest Human Services Chapter** to guide the work for the next 20 years.

They are hoping for responses by July 31, 2023.


This event was well attended by the public and allowed for open dialogue between the schools, the Council, and the community.
