Also, remember to bring your favorite coffee mug to help reduce waste at our next staff meeting.








City Hall will be closed on June 19 in observance of Juneteenth, a holiday for City of Federal Way employees.

Juneteenth, also known as Freedom Day, symbolizes the official end of slavery in Galveston, Texas, on June 19, 1865. This momentous occasion celebrates the freedom of the last African Americans enslaved in the United States.

Located on Strand Street in Galveston, the **Juneteenth historical marker commemorates** the day when Union soldiers arrived on June 19, 1865, to inform enslaved black Texans that slavery had ended, **two and a half years after President Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation**.

It serves as a reminder of this significant event in history.

ENVIRONMENTALLY FRIENDLY FWPD ZERO DS MOTORCYCLES



Federal Way police officers frequently employ dual sports on the BPA trail, within our beautiful parks system, in the alleyways behind businesses, and in other areas not easily accessible by police cars or on foot.

We have upgraded our dual-sport fleet with two powerful electric motorcycles, **the Zero DS**.

These motorcycles boast an impressive range of over 80 miles an hour and have a whopping 78 pounds of torque, allowing officers to patrol confidently for an entire 10-hour shift while carrying all their equipment.

Despite their off-road appearance, **dual sports are street-legal**, with blinkers and headlights.

The Zero DS carries the EV industry's highest power and energy density battery and offers several advantages to the community: Firstly, they are 100 percent electric, eliminating the need for gasoline.

There is no requirement for oil or filter changes, no clutch, and no engine noise! Moreover, they are compact enough to navigate single-track trails when necessary and equipped with police sirens and lights. When you see our officers on dual-sports this summer, wave at them and inquire about the Zero DS motorcycles!
