BIG NEWS FOR PUBLIC WORKS!

On May 19, The City Center Access Project was chosen by the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) for financing the Move Ahead Washington (MAWA) - Capital Projects program of the 2023 –25 Transportation Budget.

That state funding for the City Center Access Project is \$30,000,000.

Widening S 324th St. in Federal Way, adding more lanes and bike lanes, and enhancing multi-modal access to the Federal Way Transit Center and light rail station are all included in the project's scope.

As the City of Federal Way looks to take some procedural steps to obligate this with the State, this is enormous headline news for our Public Works department!

In honor of National Public Works Week, May 21-27, Deputy Mayor Susan Honda and the Federal Way City Council presented a proclamation to the Federal Way Public Works Department on May 16.

"It truly does mean a lot to all the employees out there day in and day out," **EJ Walsh, Public Works Director, said**. During the City of Federal Way's Council Meeting on May 16, we had the privilege of presenting two additional proclamations to these groups:

- Councilmember Jack Dovey presented the Affordable Housing Week Proclamation to South King Housing & Homeless Partners members. In addition, affordable Housing Week strives to bring attention to the need for affordable housing in communities.
- Councilmember Jack Walsh presented the Mental Health Awareness Month Proclamation to a King County Recovery Coalition representative and community members. Mental Health Awareness Month strives to end the silence and stigma of mental health-related issues.

THE FINANCIAL UPDATES

Finance Director Steve Groom and Deputy Finance Director Chase Donnelly attended the national Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) conference in Portland, Oregon, May 21-24, attending sessions on compliance, reporting, budgeting, debt, treasury, and more. Steve participated in a GFOA alert released Thursday warning governments across the US that the Federal Debt Ceiling issue could delay Federal payments, which local government should be mindful of. The safety of public funds in banks was also a topic of discussion and communication. Steve and Chase expanded information-sharing contacts with similar cities and met with representatives of all three rating agencies.

Our Finance department team continues to monitor the economy in general, the investment environment, and City revenues as they are received. Two reasons monitoring monthly payments are essential: firstly, managing the City's budget requires ensuring that the funding we forecasted when we authorized the current year's budget arrives.

Secondly, revenues such as Sales Tax, Lodging Tax, and Real Estate Excise Tax (REET) are current indicators of the health of the economy's local retail, hospitality, and real estate sectors within the City of Federal Way. According to the most recent receipts, Sales Tax is up 16% over the prior year, Lodging Tax is up 3% over the preceding year, and REET is down 22% compared to the previous year. Property values rose 19% last year, and mortgage rates have impacted the pace of local sales.
