Troubleshooting Murray mowers with driver

Troubleshooting a Murray lawnmower tractor can provide a methodical means of evaluating the mower to help identify the cause of operational problems, some of which will arise only from normal use, every day. Checking the individual operating components of <u>the</u> lawn mower, as well as reviewing the procedures that begin can often identify and resolve operational problems, saving the cost of potentially expensive repair bills.

Instructions

- 1 Start the Murray lawn mower. Move the choke to the "Start" position, press the brake clutch button / lever forward with your foot and try to start the machine. Check the level of fuel in the lawnmower if it does not start and add the recently acquired fuel if necessary, as a first step before continuing to solve more in-depth problems
- 2 Remove the spark plug wire from the spark plug if the mower will not start and smells like gas, indicating that the engine is flooded. Loosen and remove the spark plug with a spark plug wrench. Thread a suitable replacement spark plug into the engine by hand and firmly tighten with the spark plug wrench. Place the spark plug wire back on the tip of the spark plug. Start the mower and see if this solves the problem.
- 3 Locate the battery for the Murray lawn mower if a click sound is detected and the mower does not roll over. Tighten the battery wires at the battery terminals with a wrench or an adjustable screwdriver. Examine the wires to determine if the plastic cover is broken or damaged and wrapped with electrical tape if repair is necessary.
- 4 Lift the Murray seat by <u>riding lawn mower</u> and locate the disconnect pressure switch, if the driver still does not start. Check the terminal connections between the wires and the damage switch and its correct installation. Push loose connectors into the terminals, securely crimp connectors to the wires with tweezers or a damaged wire wrap with insulating tape.
- 5 Remove the air filter case cover if the mower runs at rough idle or will not work when it is hot. Pull the air filter out of the box and verify that excess dirt, debris or damage. Have a worn filter and replace it with a new one. Clean the inside of the filter housing with a cloth before installing the new filter and fix the filter cover in place.
- 6 Replace a worn cutting blade on the Murray <u>lawn mower</u> if the grass is not cut correctly or if there is excessive vibration during operation due to a damaged blade. Raise the cutting platform to the highest point and place a wooden block against the bottom of the cutting platform. Turn the blade to fit the wood in place. Loosen and remove the cutting blade with an adjustable wrench. Install a new blade, making sure to mount the washers and blade bolt in the same order as on the old sheet. Install the blade assembly on the spindle under the cover and tighten with the adjustable wrench. 7 Stop the machine completely and remove the accumulated grass and dirt from under the <u>cutting platform</u>, if there are problems with vibration, mowing and unloading the cut grass. Clean the cover with water from a garden hose or scrape.

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
